Measles

We have been informed by Birmingham City Council that there is an increase in the number of people with measles in Birmingham. Most of these are young children who have not had their MMR (measles) vaccine.

As a result of this, all staff in school are being very vigilant in looking out for children with possible symptons. If we suspect that a child does have symptons, we will isolate them from other children and call parents to take take them home.

If this happens, it is important that the child remains at home and is not taken to their GP or any other healthcare provider. Instead, please phone for advice and say it could be measles. Advice is available on the the NHS website, UK Health Security Agency webpages, NHS 111 and from the GP.

Measles is an infectious disease and can be serious. Children and adults can catch up on any missed vaccines. Please contact your GP to book an appointment for the Measles (MMR) vaccine.
